On the Assessors web page there is a great tool that gives you an idea ahead of time and will estimate your property taxes. Just click on the <u>Property Tax Estimator</u> link at the very bottom of the Assessing Department web page and follow the steps. Forms for Homeowners Principal Residence Exemptions and Property Transfer Affidavits are also available through links on the bottom of that page.

The Assessing Department will be conducting an inspection of properties throughout the township during the 2016 year as part of the standard Assessing Administration process mandated by the State of Michigan. These visits will not necessarily increase your tax bill unless new structures or additions are discovered; usually caused by not obtaining proper permits. Some improvements may not require permits, however may still add value to your property, therefore requiring this update process for the township to remain in compliance with State Tax Commission guidelines.
